## RETAIL FURMITURE REPCRT FCR APRIL 1951

Furniture store sales showed a decline of 5 per cent in April.There were decreases in all types of sales, although the 3 per cent decline in cash sales was less than that reported for credit sales. Instalment sales were down 5 per cent, while charge-account sales showed a decrease of 10 per cent. The downturn in sales brought total volume to a level 2 per cent below that of the previous April. This year-toyear decrease zas aue to a decline of 12 per cent in instalment sales, which, because of the importance of instalment business, was more than enough tc offset increases of 8 per cent and 14 per cent for cash and charge-account sales, respectively.

Instalment accounts receivable declined 2 per cent in April, but shosed an increase of 1 per cent over April 30, 1950. Collections on instalment accounts experienced the usual downturn in April, but, when related to first-of-month receivables, yielded a collection ratio of 11 per cert, the same as in the previous month.

The retail value of inventories at furniture stores increased 2 per cent during ipril and at tine month-end was 36 per cent above the level of a year ago. it the prevailing rate of sales, inventories on hand as of hpril 30 were equal to about 6 months' supply, the same as at the previous month-end, but above a year ago when stocks were equivalent to about 5 months' supply.
