RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR APRIL 1952

April sales at retail furniture stores increased 3 per cent over the previous month. Instalment and charge-account sales increased 2 per cent and 6 per cent, respectively, but there was a decline of 3 per cent in cash sales. Total sales were also above April of last year. The increase of 2 per cent reflected a year-to-year expansion of 9 per cent in instalment sales; both cash and charge-account sales declined by 8 per cent.

Instalment accounts outstanding on April 30 were unchanged from the preceding month-end, but were 1 per cent above the level of April 30 a year ago. Collections on these accounts dropped 7 per cent during the month and were 6 per cent below those of the same month a year ago.

The retail value of inventories increased 2 per cent during April, but continued substantially below a year ago. At the current rate of sales, stocks on hand at the end of the month amounted to about 5 months' supply.
