RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR 1AY 1952

Total sales of furniture stores increased sharply in May, reflecting increases in all types of sales. The largest increase, 27 per cent, occurred in instalment sales, while cash and charge-account sales increased 17 per cent and 11 per cent, respectively. Instalment sales were also up sharply from a year ago, but cash and charge-account sales were moderately below May of last year.

Instalment accounts outstanding increased 3 per cent from April to May, and at the month-end were 5 per cent above the level of a year ago. Collections on instalment accounts increased 8 per cent in May, but were practically unchanged from May 1951.

The retail value of inventories dropped 3 per cent during May, reducing month-end stocks to a level 16 per cent below that of a year ago. At the current rate of sales, merchandse on hand is equivalent to approximately 4 months' supply.
