RETAIL FURNITURE-REPORT FOR FEBRUARY 1965

Instalment accounts receivable at reporting furniture stores showed a further moderate decline in February, as is customary at this time of the year. At the month-end these accounts were 5 per cent larger than on the corresponding date of 1964.

The rate of repayment slackened somewhat in February but was about the same as a year earlier.

Charge accounts outstanding, which also decline sessonally in February, were down 4 per cent from January but showed little change from February 1964.

Credit sales, after falling off more than seasonally in January, in creased 3 per cent in February. This was the first February gain in charge-account business in five years. Cash sales showed the usual small contraction during the month, offsetting part of the expansion in in credit business. Both cash and credit sales are showing year-to-year gains so far this year.
