RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 1965

Instalment accounts receivable of reporting furniture stores increased I per cent in September, a month in which little change is usual. The rate of collection on these accounts was about the same as in August, but declined somewhat from a year ago.

Charge account indebtedness increased slightly and at the month-end was approximately the same as a year earlier.

Total sales of reporting stores, which usually decline in September showed little change from August this year. A comparison with September 1964 shows particularly marked increases in both instalment and cash transactions. In the first nine months of 1964 total sales were 6 per cent larger than in the corresponding period last year.
