RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT

NOTICE OF TERMINATION

This is the final G.16 monthly retail furniture report to be issued by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

During the past few years, national statistical agencies in consultation with representatives from retailing have been working to improve the statistics on retail trade. The Bureau of the Census, which has general responsibility for the retail trade statistics programs of the Federal Government, is broadening its activities in this field and, at the same time, the Federal Reserve is transferring appropriate parts of its retail trade data collection program to that agency.

At present the Bureau of the Census publishes national statistics for end-of-month instalment and charge accounts receivable. These are shown in the Census Bureau's "Wonthly Retail Trade Report," which includes separate figures for furniture stores. However, the sample design used by Census to develop the estimates of accounts receivable will produce data only for the United States as a whole, so that statistics for individual areas will not be available from Census.

Basic data from the Census retail collection program will be utilized by the Federal Reserve Board in preparing its regular monthly estimates of consumer credit Statistics.

RETAIL FURNITURE REPORT FOR JANUARY 1966

Instalment accounts receivable at reporting furniture stores declined slightly in January, as is usual at this time of year. However, they continued well above the corresponding period last year. These accounts were being repaid at about the same rate as in January 1965—in about seventeen months, on the average.

Charge account balances declined 8 per cent from a month ago and at the end of January were about the same as at this time last year.

Sales at reporting furniture stores exhibited the normal seasonal contraction during the month, with cash and instalment business registering the largest declines. Sales of all types were up from a year ago with cash volume up 10 per cent and credit transactions up 8 per cent.
