Instalment accounts receivable at reporting department stores, which usually decline slightly during May, were one per cent below the amount outstanding at the end of April and continued well above the corresponding period of 1962. Charge accounts receivable rose slightly but were unchanged from their year-ago level. Collection ratios on instalment accounts were the same in May as in April, but those on charge accounts rose somewhat.

Cash sales of reporting stores rose slightly during May, but credit sales were unchanged from the preceding month.
