DEPARTMENT STORE GREDIT - NOVEMBER 1965
Instalment accounts receivable of reporting department stores were up 3 per cent in November and at the month-end were nearly onetenth larger than a year earlier. These accountstwere being repaid, on the average, in about ten months, approximately the same rate as in the past three months.

Charge account indebtedness increased in November, as is usual at this time of year. By the end, of the month the amount outstanding on these accounts was 5 per cent larger than on November 30, 1964....

Department store sales were up 15 per cent from a month ago, in line with seasonal expectations, and were one-tenth above the November 1964 volume. All types of sales contributed to the gain, with cash sales typically registering the largest month-to-month change.
