CONSUMER INSTALMENT CREDIT AT COMMERCIAL BANKS

JANJARY 1957

Consumer instalment credit outstanding at commercial banks declined slightly in January to an estimated \$11,616 million at the month-end. The decline in other consumer goods paper, which accounted for most of the decrease, reflected in part large repurchases of paper by retail outlets. Total balances continued above the year-ago level.

New extensions of credit were up \$11 million in January, with increases in automobile credit more than off-setting declines in other categories.
