Consumer instalment credit at sales finance companies totaled \$12,807 million at the end of July, \$114 million higher than in June. Increases in retail passenger automotive paper of \$135 million and personal loans of \$37 million were partly offset by a decline of \$58 million in other consumer goods paper. At the end of July, consumer instalment paper held by sales finance companies was 11 per cent higher than a year earlier, with retail passenger automotive paper accounting for three-fourths of the expansion.

Consumer credit extensions of \$1,159 million were \$83 million greater than in June and at record level. Retail automotive paper accounted for almost two-thirds of the increase.

Business credit outstanding at sales finance companies increased \$22 million in July, to \$5,796 million at month-end.
