There was an increase of \$3 million during December in retail passenger auto credit at sales finance companies. Other consumer goods and personal loans also increased over the previous month.

These increases were greater than seasonal and brought the companies' consumer credit holdings to a total \$140 million above the November outstandings and \$221 million over the year-earlier total.

Sales finance company purchases of retail passenger auto paper were up \$112 million from November and \$9 million above December 1963. Extensions of other consumer goods paper and of personal loans, likewise increased over November purchases and over those of December 1963.

Business credit extensions increased during December, and outstandings were higher at month-end. As in November, the expansion reflected a sizeable increase in the area of wholesale automotive paper.

For the year as a whole the total net change in sales finance company outstandings was \$1,239 million as compared to \$1,329 million in 1963, total extensions having risen \$1,356 million or 10.7 per cent above 1963 extensions.
