Consumer instalment credit outstanding at sales finance companies decreased \$44 million in January. This was the first decline in outstandings in ten months, and followed the large \$259 million increase registered in December. However, this year's decline was much less than in January 1968, when all major types of credit contributed to the \$112 million decrease in outstandings.

Total consumer instalment credit extensions by sales finance companies amounted to \$1,227 million in January-a \$308 million decrease from December, but \$149 million more than in January 1968.

Business credit outstanding increased \$157 million in January, with wholesale automotive paper accounting for most of the rise.
