CHANGES IN COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS BY INDUSTRY

All industrial classifications participated in the increase of \$320 million in commercial, industrial, and agricultural loans at weekly reporting member banks during the week ended September 14.

The principal increases were \$80 million in loans to manufacturers of textiles, apparel, and leather products, \$34 million to commodity dealers, \$33 million to manufacturers of food, liquor, and tobacco products, \$29 million to the wholesale and retail trade, and \$28 million to sales finance companies.

The increase in loans to manufacturers of textiles, apparel, and leather products was the largest weekly increase in this business category since the series was inaugurated in 1951.

Changes in loans during the week and since the mid-year are shown below; the third column shows the changes during the comparable period last year:
