COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$66 million at weekly reporting member banks during the week ended July 15.

The principal net increases were \$31 million in loans to "all other" types of business concerns, \$28 million to the construction industry, \$19 million in bankers' acceptances, \$13 million each to manufacturers of textiles, apparel, and leather products and to manufacturers of "other" nondurable goods, and \$12 million each to manufacturers of machinery and to the mining industry.

The largest net decrease was \$20 million to transportation, communication, and other public utilities.

The outstanding loans and changes during the week and since year-end are shown below; fourth column shows the changes during the comparable period last year.
