## COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$27 million at weekly reporting member banks during the week ended October 28.

The principal net decreases were \$42 million in loans to manufacturers of machinery, \$32 million to manufacturers of textiles, apparel, and leather products, and \$23 million to the mining industry, which includes producers of petroleum and natural gas.

The larger net increases were \$54 million in loans to commodity dealers and \$48 million to retail trade.

The outstanding loans and changes during the week and since mid-year are shown below; fourth column shows the changes during the comparable period last year.
