## H. 12 COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased in ten districts a net of \$511 million at weekly reporting member banks during the week ended May 5.

The principal net increases were \$115 million in loans to retail trade, \$76 million to transportation, communication, and other public utilities, \$58 million in bankers' acceptances, \$40 million to manufacturers of transportation equipment, \$39 million to manufacturers of machinery, \$35 million to the construction industry, \$34 million to manufacturers of "other" durable goods, and \$32 million to unclassified borrowers.

The largest net decrease was \$38 million in loans to the mining industry, which includes producers of petroleum and natural gas.

Outstanding loans and changes from a week ago and a year ago are shown below; cumulative changes since year-end and during the comparable period last year are shown in the last two columns.

Total commercial and industrial loans decreased \$16 million during the month of April 1965, compared with an increase of \$1,579 million during the month of March 1965 and a decrease of \$115 million in April 1964.
