COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased in nine districts and a net of \$424 million at weekly reporting member banks during the week ended May 18.

The principal net increases were \$132 million in loans to retail trade, \$64 million to petroleum refiners, \$52 million to manufacturers of "other" nondurable goods, \$49 million to manufacturers of transportation equipment, \$46 million to manufacturers of machinery, \$38 million to manufacturers of textiles, apparel, and leather products, and \$51 million to "all other" types of business concerns.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$44 million in loans to manufacturers of primary metals.

Outstanding loans and changes from a week ago and a year ago are shown below; cumulative changes since year-end and during the comparable period last year are shown in the last two columns.
