COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Outstanding

Commercial and industrial loans increased in nine districts and a net of \$304 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended March 12.

The principal net increases were \$75 million in loans to manufacturers of machinery, \$61 million to manufacturers of chemicals and rubber products, and \$46 million to manufacturers of "other" fabricated metal products.

The larger offsetting net decreases were \$43 million in loans to manufacturers of food, liquor, and tobacco products, and \$46 million to "all other" types of business concerns.
