### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$908 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended June 21.

The principal net increases were \$161 million in loans for other public utilities, \$142 million in loans for services, and \$164 million in unclassified loans.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$112 million in loans to manufacturers of petroleum refining.
