COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$506 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended July 5.

The principal net increases were \$90 million in loans for other public utilities, \$114 million in loans for communication, and \$127 million in loans to manufacturers of food, liquor and tobacco.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$74 million in loans to manufacturers of chemical and rubber.

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL TERM LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Total commercial and industrial term loans were \$30,763 million on June 28, after loan reclassification at a large bank resulted in a reduction of \$464 million in such loans. After the revision, this was a decrease of \$1,340 million from the comparable data a year ago and a decrease of \$118 million from the last Wednesday in May.

The principal net changes were \$318 million in all other loans, \$205 million in loans for other public utilities, and \$136 million in loans for services.

The total of all business term loans on June 28 represented approximately 45 percent of business outstanding at large commercial banks in the series.
