### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$243 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended November 15.

The principal net increases were, \$59 million in loans to manufactures of machinery, \$53 million in total unclassified loans and \$50 million in loans for retail trade.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$22 million in loans to manufactures of textiles, apparel and leather.
