COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$567 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended December 13.

The principal net increases were \$278 million in total unclassified loans, \$66 million in loans for transportation and \$62 million in foreign commercial and industrial loans.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$23 million in loans to manufactures of transportation equipment.
