### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$939 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended August 29.

The principal net decreases were \$111 million in loans for communication, \$108 million in total unclassified loans, and \$104 million in loans for transportation.

The largest offsetting net increase was \$18 million in loans to manufacturers of other nondurable goods.
