### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$261 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended November 21.

The principal net increases were \$151 million in loans for other public utilities, \$135 million in loans for commodity dealers, and \$102 million in loans to manufacturers of food, liquor and tobacco.

The largest offsetting net decrease was \$74 million in loans for other wholesale trade.
