Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$986 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended March 6, 1974.

The principal net increases were \$243 million in all other loans, \$218 million in loans for retail trade and \$199 million in total unclassified loans.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$95 million in loans for commodity dealers.

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL TERM LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Total commercial and industrial term loans were \$41,486 million as of February. This was an increase of \$5,859 million over the comparable data a year ago and a decrease of \$77 million from the last Wednesday in January.

The principal net changes were \$308 million in all other loans, \$148 million in foreign commercial and industrial loans and \$127 million in loans for retail trade.

The total of all business term loans on February 27 represents 45 per cent of business outstanding at large commercial banks in the series.
