### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and Industrial loans increased a net of \$459 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended July 2, 1975.

The principal net increases were \$200 million in loans for foreign commercial and industrial, \$133 million in loans for communication and \$107 million in loans for petroleum refining.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$71 million in loans for machinery.

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL TERM LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Total commercial and industrial term loans were \$47,796 million as of June 25, 1975. This was an increase of \$3,224 million over the comparable data a year ago and a decrease of \$219 million from the last Wednesday in May.

The principal net changes were \$292 million in loans for machinery, \$106 million in loans for services and \$102 million in loans for food, liquor and tobacco.

The total of all business term loans on June 25 represents 48 percent of business outstanding at large commercial banks in the series.
