### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$62 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ended September 3, 1975.

The principal net increases were \$123 million in all other loans, \$109 million in loans to commodity dealers, and \$70 million in foreign commercial and industrial loans.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$58 million in loans to retail trade, also \$58 million in construction loans.

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL TERM LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Total commercial and industrial term loans were \$47,395 million as of August 27, 1975. This was an increase of \$1,381 million over the comparable data a year ago and a decrease of \$248 million from the last Wednesday in July.

The principal net changes were \$145 million in loans for services, \$116 million in loans for other public utilities and \$62 million in loans for other nondurable goods.

The total of all business term loans on August 27 represents 48 percent of business outstanding at large commercial banks in the series.
