### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$186 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending March 3, 1976.

The principal net decreases were \$121 million in loans for other public utilities, \$119 million in loans for services and \$111 million in loans for construction.

The largest offsetting increase was \$133 million in unclassified loans.

H.12(B) COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL TERM LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Total commercial and industrial term loans were \$46,870 million as of February 25, 1976. This was a decrease of \$1,412 million over the comparable data a year ago and a decrease of \$239 million from the last Wednesday in January.

The principal net changes were \$303 million in all other loans, \$117 million in loans for construction and \$55 million in loans for other public utilities.

The total of all business term loans on February 25 represents 49 percent of business outstanding at large commercial banks in the series.
