### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and Industrial loans decreased a net of \$312 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending July 14, 1976.

The principal net decreases were \$106 million in loans for communication, \$78 million foreign commercial and industrial loans, and \$67 million in loans for transportation.

The largest offsetting increase was \$93 million in loans for bankers acceptances.
