COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$90 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending July 21, 1976.

The principal net increases were \$111 million in loans for services, \$79 million in loans for other public utilities, and \$68 million in all other loans.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$125 million in loans for commodity dealers.
