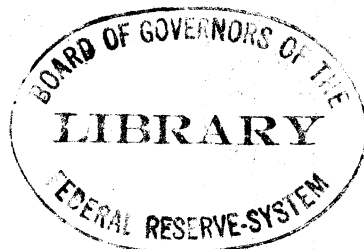

COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$285 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending August 18, 1976.

The principal net decreases were \$149 million in loans for other public utilities, \$112 million for all other loans and \$51 million in loans for other retail trade.

The largest offsetting increase was \$132 million in loans for bankers acceptances.
