### COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$475 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending September 15, 1976.

The principal net increases were \$92 million in loans for commodity dealers, \$82 million for all other loans, and \$79 million in loans for primary metals.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$122 million in loans for retail trade.
