COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$381 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending September 22, 1976.

The principal net increases were \$228 million for unclassified loans, \$178 million in loans for petroleum refining, and \$172 million in loans for retail trade.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$72 million in loans for bankers acceptances.
