COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$145 million at weekly reporting large commercial banks during the week ending April 27, 1977.

The principal net changes were \$67 million for all other loans, \$63 million in loans for retail trade and \$56 million in loans for other public utilities.

The largest offsetting increase was \$103 million for unclassified loans.
