 COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$436 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the Week ending October 19, 1977.

The principal net increases were \$341 million in loans for bankers acceptances and \$100 million in loans for commodity dealers.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$92 million in loans for textiles, apparel and leather.
