COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$851 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial Banks during the Week ending March 15, 1978.

The principal net increases were \$105 million in loans for mining (including crude petroleum and natural gas) and \$104 million in loans for bank acceptances.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$95 million in loans for petroleum refining.
