COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$279 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the Week ending March 22, 1978.

The principal net increases were \$118 million in loans for retail trade and \$59 million in loans for transportation.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$198 million in loans for bankers acceptances.
