COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$462 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the Week ending July 12.

The principal net decreases were \$467 million in loans for bankers acceptances and \$71 million in loans for commodity dealers.

The largest offsetting increase was \$65 million in loans for machinery.
