COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans decreased a net of \$117 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the Week ending July 19, 1978.

The principal net decreases were \$139 million in loans for bankers acceptances and \$102 million in loans for chemicals and rubber.

The largest offsetting increase was \$59 million in loans for other public utilities.
