COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$580 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the week ending October 11, 1978.

The principal net increases were \$184 million in loans for bankers acceptance and \$171 million in loans for other wholesale trade.

The largest offsetting decrease was \$139 million in loans for chemicals and rubber.
