COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL LOANS OUTSTANDING BY INDUSTRY

Commercial and industrial loans increased a net of \$447 million at Weekly Reporting Large Commercial banks during the Week ending November 15, 1978.

The principal net increases were \$213 million in loans for other wholesale trade and \$136 million in loans for mining (including crude petroleum and natural gas).

The largest offsetting decrease was \$75 million in loans for textiles, apparel, and leather.
