BANK DEBITS

Volume of business for the week ending August 30, as measured by debits to individual accounts reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in leading centers, totaled \$7,219,000,000 or \$215,000,000 below the total for the preceding week. All of the larger centers, except Chicago and Milwaukee, show smaller figures than the week before. New York City reports a decline of \$51,000,000, or of 1.3 per cent for the week, as compared with an average decline of 2.9 per cent for all reporting centers.

As compared with the week ending August 31, 1921, the volume of business for the week under review shows an increase of \$804,000,000, or of 12.5 per cent. For New York City, mainly because of the larger volume of stock exchange transactions, the increase over last year's total was \$666,000,000, or 21.2 per cent. Large increases, as compared with last year, are also shown for Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and Detroit, while Baltimore, New Orleans, Minneapolis, Kansas City and San Francisco report smaller totals than for the corresponding week in 1921.

The total number of centers reporting this week is 244, of which 163 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
