BANK DEBITS

Bank debits for the week ending October 3 totaled \$10,103,662,000 or 14 per cent in excess of the total of \$8,838,523,000 reported for the preceding week. This increase is due largely to end-of-month and end-of-quarter transactions and settlements. For New York City the increase was \$641,881,000 or 16 per cent. Of the other larger centers Chicago reports an increase of \$74,922,000, Boston - \$68,841,000, San Francisco - \$51,493,000, Philadelphia - \$45,177,000, Cleveland - \$34,648,000, and St. Louis - \$33,295,000.

As compared with the corresponding period of 1922 bank debits for the week under review show an increase of \$35,379,000 or less than one per cent. New York City reports a decrease for the same period of \$348,898,000 or 7 per cent. Increases over last year's figures are shown for San Francisco, Los Angeles, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Boston and St. Louis.

Debits to individual account are reported by banks in 250 centers of which 246 are included in the summary by Federal reserve banks.
