BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board by banks in leading cities for the week ending May 6, reached the record total of \$13,455,000,000, or 29.3 per cent above the total of \$10,407,000,000 reported for the preceding week. New York City reported an increase of \$2,165,000,000, while other large increases were as follows: Chicago \$231,000,000, Cleveland \$51,000,000, Boston \$48,000,000, Philadelphia \$42,000,000, St. Louis \$33,000,000 and New Orleans \$28,000,000.

As compared with the week ending May 7, 1924, debits for the week under review show an increase of \$2,964,000,000 or 28.3 per cent. Substantial increases are shown for all of the more important centers except Portland, Ore., the largest increases being as follows: New York City \$2,181,000,000, Chicago \$189,000,000, Boston \$56,000,000, Philadelphia \$40,000,000, Cleveland \$39,000,000, San Francisco \$33,000,000, and Detroit and Los Angeles \$31,000,000 each.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, were \$12,757,451,000, as compared with \$9,810,407,000 for the preceding week and \$9,860,184,000 for the week ending May 7, 1924.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 257 centers, of which 253 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
