BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported by banks in leading cities for the week ended October 4, aggregated \$9,140,000,000, or 17 percent above the total reported for the preceding week and 3 percent above the total for the corresponding week of last year.

Aggregate debits for the 141 cities for which a separate total has been maintained since January 1919 amounted to \$8,360,000,000, compared with \$7,181,000,000 the preceding week and \$8,131,000,000 the week ended October 5 of last year.
