BANK DEBITS

Debits to deposit accounts (except interbank accounts), as reported by banks in leading cities for the week ended July 31, aggregated \$7,461,000,000. Total debits during the 13 weeks ended July 31 amounted to \$106,724,000,000, or 3 percent above the total reported for the corresponding period a year ago.
