DEPARTMENT STORE SALES IN JANUARY, 1930 Preliminary report

Department store sales for January were 2 per cent smaller than in the corresponding month a year ago, according to preliminary reports made to the Federal reserve system by 490 stores located in leading cities of all Federal reserve districts. For the country as a whole the decrease was the same as that shown in the comparison of December with December a year ago.

Percentage changes in sales between January, 1929 and January, 1930 are given by districts in the following table:
