## Condition of Weekly Reporting Member Banks in Leading Cities

The condition statement of weekly reporting member banks in 101 leading cities shows the following principal changes for the week ended December 30: Increases of \$1,503,000,000 in holdings of Treasury certificates of indebtedness and \$1,120,000,000 in United States Government deposits; and decreases of \$249,000,000 in loans to brokers and dealers in securities, \$188,000,000 in holdings of Treasury bills, \$229,000,000 in reserve balances with Federal Reserve Banks, \$173,000,000 in balances with domestic banks, \$247,000,000 in demand deposits-adjusted and \$278,000,000 in deposits credited to domestic banks.

Commercial, industrial and agricultural loans declined \$97,000,000 and loans to brokers and dealers in securities declined \$249,000,000, both largely in New York

Holdings of Treasury certificates of indebtedness increased in all districts, the principalincreases being \$636,000,000 in New York City, \$216,000,000 in the Chicago District, and \$109,000,000 in the Cleveland District. Holdings of Treasury bills declined \$72,000,000 in the Chicago District, \$62,000,000 in New York City, \$25,000,000 in the Kansas City District and \$188,000,000 at all reporting member banks.

Demand deposits-adjusted declined \$106,000,000 in New York City, \$40,000,000 in the Boston District and \$247,000,000 at all reporting member banks. United States Government deposits increased in all districts, the principal increases being \$453,000,000 in New York City, \$183,000,000 in the Chicago District, \$78,000,000 in the Cleveland District and \$70,000,000 in the San Francisco District.

Deposits credited to domestic banks declined \$97,000,000 in New York City, \$71,000,000 in the Chicago District, and \$278,000,000 at all reporting member banks.
